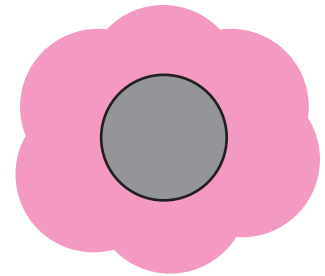
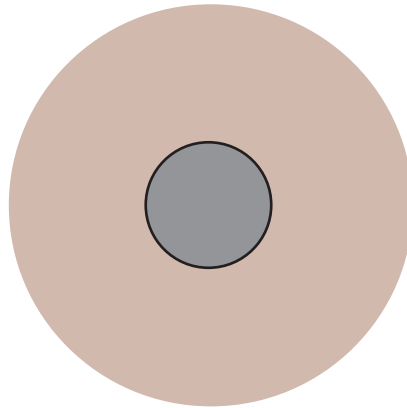
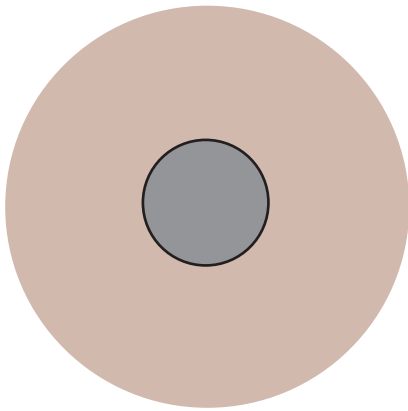
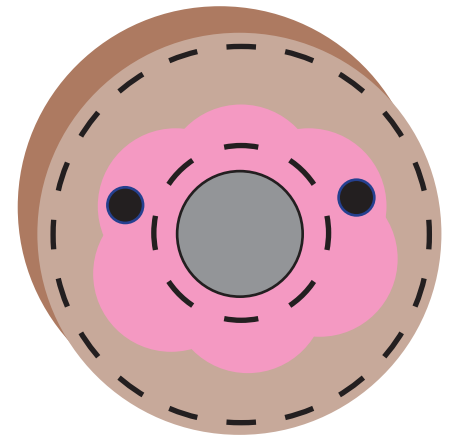
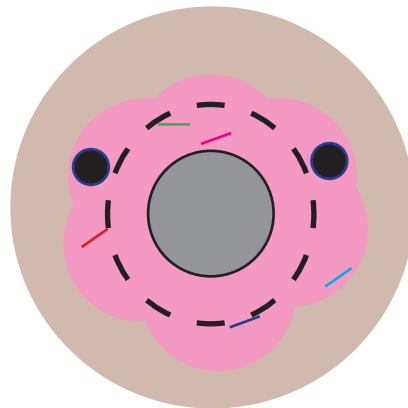
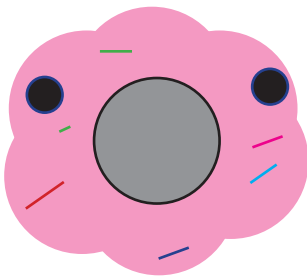


1. Cut out two circles and an icing shape. You can use a dinner plate or a salad plate as a template. Polar fleece and felt are the nicest to work with.



2. For a donut, cut out a circle from the center of each, using a smaller cup or thread spool for a template. Make the circle “small enough”; otherwise, it won’t look like a donut. Skip the circle for a fluffy cream filled pastry.



3. Attach eyes, mouth, sprinkles, or other decorations to the icing shape. Sew or use glue. Large, wide-set eyes are cuter than small, close-set eyes. Beads make great sprinkles!

4. Sew outer edge of icing to top piece of donut body.

5. Sew inner circle together, making sure thread goes through all three layers of fabric.

6. Sew outer layer together. Leave an inch open for stuffing; stuff; complete circle.
